REVOCATION OF APPOINTMENT OF A PRIVATE WAREHOUSE/CUSTOMS AREA (Customs Act, Chap. 78:01)

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon the Comptroller of Customs and Excise under the provisions of the Customs Act, Chap. 78:01, I, Kawanhar Doopan, Comptroller of Customs and Excise, do hereby revoke the appointment of the place described in the Schedule hereunder as a Private Warehouse/Customs Area, which said place was appointed a Private Warehouse/Customs Area by the Comptroller of Customs and Excise for the warehousing of certain goods by Automotive Components Limited, O'Meara Industrial Estate, Arima, under the provisions of section 263(2) of the Customs Act, Chap. 78:01 and which said appointment was published as Notice No. 639 on 2nd April, 1997 in the *Trinidad and Tobago Gazette*.

SCHEDULE

An area measuring 42.68 metres long by 10.06 metres wide comprising 429.36 square metres located in a building constructed of concrete and steel with a roof of galvanized steel sheets. An area of twenty-one (21) square metres is to be deducted as it does not form part of the bonded warehouse, actual area is 409 square metres. The building is located in the central/eastern section of the premises with walls of concrete and steel with BRC material reinforced at the upper area. OFFER OF SCHOLARSHIPS FOR THE BACHELOR OF SCIENCE DEGREE IN CIVIL ENGINEERING AT THE UNIVERSITY OF THE WEST INDIES. ST. AUGUSTINE—2001 AWARDS

APPLICATIONS are invited from suitably qualified nationals of Trinidad and Tobago for the award of eight (8) scholarships being offered by the Government of the Republic of Trinidad and Tobago for Studies leading to the Bachelor of Science degree in Civil Engineering at the University of the West Indies, St. Augustine, commencing from the 2001/2002 academic year.

2. On the completion of the course, the successful candidates will be required to work in the position of Civil Engineer in the Ministry of Infrastructure Development and Local Government.

Eligibility

- 3. All applicants must-
 - (a) be citizens of the Republic of Trinidad and Tobago;
 - (b) possess the General Certificate of Education (GCE) or recognized equivalent (e.g. Caribbean Examination Council (CXC) General Proficiency Grades I or II) with passes in at least five (5) subjects at Ordinary Level, which must include Mathematics, Chemistry and English Language; and
 - (i) two (2) Advanced level passes in Mathematics and Physics; or
 - (ii) the National Examination Council Engineering Technician's Diploma in Civil Engineering with an average of 65% or more in the final year examination.

Mature applicants who hold qualifications which are equivalent to the normal requirement (whether formal qualifications or work experience) will be considered for entry on a case by case basis.

4. The award of a scholarship would be conditional upon the candidate being admitted to the programme of study by the University of the West Indies (UWI), St. Augustine.

Preparation and Submission of Application

- 5. Interested persons are advised that scholarship application forms and detailed information concerning the terms of the awards and the prescribed conditions for the submission of applications should be obtained from the following offices:
 - (a) Scholarships and Advanced Training Division, Ministry of Human Development, Youth and Culture, ABMA Building, 55–57, St. Vincent Street, Port-of-Spain, between the hours of 8.00 a.m. and 4.00 p.m. Monday to Friday;

 - (c) Offices of the Republic of Trinidad and Tobago Government Diplomatic Missions.
- 6. Completed applications must reach the Scholarships and Advanced Training Division at the above address no later than 19th April, 2001.
- 7. Applicants who are Public Officers must submit their applications through their Permanent Secretaries/Heads of Department/Statutory Authorities, as appropriate.
 - 8. Applications not submitted by the closing date or in accordance with the prescribed conditions will not be considered.
