CARNIVAL 2001—PUBLIC NOTICE

THE ATTENTION of the Public is invited to the Order of the President dated the 12th day of February, 2001 declaring the period of Carnival in respect of the year 2001 (in this Notice referred to as "the said Regulations") both of which are published as Supplements to the "Trinidad and Tobago Gazette", No. 28 dated the 13th day of February, 2001. (Legal Notices Nos. 26 and 27) and also the provision of sections 5 and 6 of the Public Holidays and Festivals Act, Chap. 19:05, set out in paragraphs 2–7 below.

- 2. Any person who appears in public masked or otherwise disguised except during the Carnival, or who during the Carnival contravenes any of the said Regulations, shall be liable to a fine of one thousand dollars and to imprisonment for six months.
- 3. If during the Carnival any person shall have with him in any public place any articles which by virtue of any of the said Regulations he is prohibited from so having, any member of the Police Service may, if he considers it expedient to do so without proceeding to arrest such persons, seize and take away such articles. All articles seized under the said Regulations shall be forefeited and shall be kept in safe custody by the Police until disposed of in such manner as the Minister may direct.
- 4. If during the Carnival any person shall have with him in any public place any article resembling a firearm or ammunition, or which, in the opinion of a member of the Police Service is likely to be used to intimidate any person or for causing injury to the person, such member of the Police Service, if he considers it in the interest of the safety of the members of the Public to do so may, notwithstanding that such article does not fall within the class of articles specifically prohibited by the said Regulations seize and take away such articles.
- 5. Any person who refuses to deliver up any articles which a member of the Police Service requires to be delivered up for seizure under the provision set out in paragraph (3) or in paragraph (4), or obstructs any member of the Police Service when acting in pursuance of any of the said provisions, he is liable to a fine of two hundred and forty dollars (\$240.00) and imprisonment for six (6) months.
- 6. It is unlawful for any person to smear or daub any substance or thing on any other person and it is also unlawful to offer or attempt or threaten to smear or daub anything on any person in order to intimidate or obtain money or anything of value from such person.
- 7. It is unlawful to appear dressed in any uniform resembling that of the Police Service, Fire Service, Prison Service or any unit of the Defence Force.
- 8. For the purpose of the provisions set out in paragraphs (3) and (5) of this notice the expression "Police Service" includes the Special Reserve Police, the Supplemental Police and City and Borough Police, and the expression "public place" includes any highway or any other premises or place to which at the material time the public has, or is permitted to have access, whether on payment or otherwise.
- 9. The attention of the public is also directed to the several Traffic Notices published in the press containing Orders regulating the use of the roads during the Carnival.

DETERMINATION OF COMPENSATION TO DEPENDANTS OF DECEASED EMPLOYEE

Re-Death of

AFI MORGAN, late of No. 6 Mission Road, San Juan, a workman lately employed with United Electrics Limited

COMPENSATION in the above matter having been deposited with me under section 8 of the Workmen's Compensation Act, the dependants of the said Afi Morgan are hereby required to appear before the Commissioner on Tuesday the 6th day of March, 2001, at 9.00 o'clock in the forenoon at the Court House, Port-of-Spain, when the Commissioner shall proceed to determine the distribution thereof.

Proof of relationship of dependants to the deceased workman will be required by the Commissioner to be furnished by claimants at the enquiry. Such proof to be in the form of certificates of birth and of marriage as in the circumstances be necessary.

A claimant for funeral expenses of the deceased must submit and prove his claim to the Commissioner on or before the 6th day of March, 2001.
