# PUBLIC STATEMENT OF THE NATIONAL LOTTERIES CONTROL BOARD In Compliance with Sections 7, 8 and 9 of The Freedom of Information Act, 1999 (FOIA)

In accordance with Sections 7, 8 and 9 of the Freedom of Information Act, 1999 (FOIA), the National Lotteries Control Board is required by law to publish the following statements which list the documents and information generally available to the public.

The Act gives members of the public: -

- A legal right for each person to access information held by the National Lotteries Control Board;
- A legal right for each person to have official information relating to him/herself amended where it is incomplete, incorrect or misleading;
- (3) A legal right to obtain reasons for adverse decisions made regarding an applicant's request of information under the FOIA; and
- (4) A legal right to complain to the Ombudsman and to apply to the High Court for Judicial Review to challenge adverse decisions made under the FOIA.

# Section 7 (1) (a) (i)

## Function and Structure of the National Lotteries Control Board

Mission Statement: -

The National Lotteries Control Board's mission is to create, promote and conduct games of chance that generate revenue for the government of Trinidad and Tobago, and to provide quality service to all its customers.

The National Lotteries Control Board is a Statutory body which reports to the Minister of Finance. The Board was established on 12<sup>th</sup> August, 1968 in accordance with an Act of Parliament, Chapter 21:04. The staff of the NLCB is headed by a Director. The establishment is divided into six responsibility areas as follows: -

- 1. <u>Director's Office</u> Overall Public Administration
- 2. <u>Secretariat</u>
  - Board Meetings
  - Records Management
  - Building Maintenance
- 3. Finance/Information Technology
  - Estimates of Revenue and Expenditure
  - Receipt of monies for tickets (On-Line, Instant and Classic Lotteries)
- 4. Operations (On-Line, Instant Lottery, Classic Lottery)

Conduct and supervision of draws/games Reports to Board

5. Marketing and Public Relations

Sponsorship, Donations, Releases, Advertising

6. Internal Audit

Auditing activities of accounts of the Board

- Policy Implementation
- Human Resource Management
- Security
- Payment of prizes (On-Line, Instant and Classic Lotteries)
- Preparation of monthly and annual financial statements

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Surplus from the operations of the games conducted by the National Lotteries Control Board is deposited into the Consolidated Fund.

- 15. Files containing Circulars (internal and external);
- 16. Reports form Section Heads;
- 17. Booklets, leaflets, posters, newspaper clippings;
- 18. Files dealing with conferences, functions etc. attended by the Board;
- 19. Inventory of furniture and appliances; and
- 20. Foreign publications on On-Line and Instant Lotteries.

## Section 7(1)(a)(v)

Procedure to be followed when accessing a document from the National Lotteries Control Board.

## General Procedure

Our policy is to answer all requests, both oral and written, for information. However, in order to have the rights given to you by the FOIA (for example, the right to challenge a decision if your request for information is refused), <u>you must make</u> <u>your request in writing</u>. The applicant must therefore complete the appropriate form (Request for Access to Official Documents) available in our Lobby for information.

## Addressing Requests

To facilitate prompt handling of your request, please address it to the Designated Officer of the NLCB.

## Details in the Request

Applicants should provide details that will allow for ready identification and location of the records that are being requested. If insufficient information is provided, clarification will be sought from the applicant. If you are not sure how to write your request or what details to include, communicate with our Designated Officer.

## Requests not handled under the FOIA

A request <u>under the FOIA</u> will not be processed to the extent that it asks for information which is currently available in the public domain, either from this public authority or from another public authority, for example, brochures and pamphlets etc.

## Responding to your Request – Retrieving Documents

The NLCB is required to furnish copies of documents only when they are in our possession or we can retrieve them from storage. Information stored in the National Archives or another storage centre will be retrieved in order to process your request.

Prior to the commencement of the Freedom of Information Act, 1999, old records may have been destroyed in accordance with the Exchequer and Audit Act, Chapter 69:01. The granting of a request for such documents may, therefore, be impossible.

#### Furnishing Documents

An applicant is entitled to copies of information we have in our possession, custody or power. We are required to furnish only one copy of a document. If we cannot make a legible copy of a document to be released, we may not attempt to reconstruct it. Instead, we will furnish the best copy possible and note its quality in our reply.

Please note we are not compelled to do the following:

- (a) Create new documents. For example, we are not required to write a new program so that a computer will print information in the format you prefer.
- (b) Perform research for you.
- Time Limits

## <u>General</u>

The FOIA sets certain time limits for us to decide whether to disclose the documents you have requested. If we fail to meet the deadlines, the FOIA gives you the right to proceed as if your request has been denied. We will try diligently to comply with the time limits, but if it appears that processing your request may take longer than the statutory limit, we will acknowledge your request and advise you of its status. Since there is a possibility that requests may be misaddressed or misrouted, you may wish to call or write to confirm that we have received the request and to ascertain its status.

## Time Allowed

We will determine whether to grant your request for access to information <u>as soon as</u> <u>practicable but no later than 30 days</u> as required by Section 15 of the FOIA. If a decision is taken to grant access to the information requested, you will be permitted to inspect the documents or be provided with copies, if you so request.

## Fees and Refunds

The Freedom of Information Fees and Charges Regulations prescribe the fees related to the search, retrieval and provision of documents. You are entitled to receive the document/s <u>within seven days of payment of the relevant fee</u>. If we fail to provide the information within the seven days period you are entitled to a refund of the fees paid in addition to access to the document/s requested.

#### <u>Section 7 (1) (a) (vi)</u>
