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DETERMINATION OF COMPENSATION TO DEPENDANTS OF DECEASED EMPLOYEE

Compensation in the above matter having been deposited with me under section 9 of the Workmen's Compensation Act, the dependants of the said Nersingh Nanan are hereby required to appear before the Commissioner on Monday the 26th day of January, 2004, at 9.00 o'clock in the forenoon at the Hall of Justice, Port-of-Spain, when the Commissioner shall proceed to determine the distribution thereof.

Proof of relationship of dependants to the deceased workman will be required by the Commissioner to be furnished by claimants at the enquiry. Such proof to be in the form of certificates of birth and of marriage as in the circumstances be necessary.

A claimant for funeral expenses of the deceased must submit and prove his claim to the Commissioner on or before the 26th day of January, 2004.

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TENDERS FOR PREQUALIFICATION OF CONSULTING FIRMS FOR THE PROVISION OF TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE TO UNDERTAKE THE SURVEY VAULT RESTORATION PROJECT, FOR THE AGRICULTURE SECTOR REFORM PROGRAMME—TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAMME (ASRP—TAP) MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE, LAND AND MARINE RESOURCES IDB LOAN NO. 882/OC-TT

IN 1996 THE GOVERNMENT OF THE REPUBLIC OF TRINIDAD AND TOBAGO (GORTT) through the Ministry of Agriculture, Land and Marine Resources accessed loan funding from the Inter-American Development Bank (IDB) to assist in the implementation of an Agriculture Sector Reform Programme—Technical Assistance Programme (ASRP—TAP), IDB Loan No. 882/OC-TT. The ASRP—TAP was designed to implement a range of policy and institutional reforms aimed at enhancing the performance of the Agricultural Sector.

One of the major areas of action under the ASRP—TAP is Land Use Policy and Administration, which is aimed at improving the management of State Lands and the functioning of the overall land market in Trinidad and Tobago.

As part of the Land Use Policy and Administration Component of the ASRP—TAP, the Government is undertaking a series of projects to strengthen the Lands and Surveys Division as well as improve the surveying profession in Trinidad and Tobago. In this regard, the GORTT is proposing to undertake a project in the Lands and Surveys Division of the Ministry of Agriculture, Land and Marine Resources aimed at restoring and protecting survey plans, maps, diagrams and other documents in the Vault of the Lands and Surveys Division of the Ministry.

The project is also aimed at implementing an effective records management system in order to prevent further deterioration of the records. The project will involve the physical restoration of plans and other relevant documents and the provision of technical assistance and institutional strengthening in order to ensure the successful implementation of the records management system.

In this connection, the GORTT is inviting expressions of interest from consultants from IDB member countries to undertake this project. Interested firms, whether acting singly or in joint venture, are required to submit a completed prequalification questionnaire along with a statement of interest.

The prequalification questionnaire can be obtained from Mrs. E. Pierre, Project Implementation Officer at the address stated below (address 1), to whom any calls and queries regarding this prequalification notice should be addressed. A copy of the prequalification questionnaire can also be downloaded from the Internet at http://www.agriculture.gov.tt.

All prequalification information must be submitted in the English Language.

Firms will be short listed in accordance with the following requirements and criteria:

Requirements:

- A. Eligibility.
- B. Existence/Non Existence of Litigation Matters.
- C. Financial Capacity.
- D. Language Capability.

Criteria:

- (1) General work experience of the firm (40 points).
- (2) Experience in Similar Work (40 points).
- (3) Experience in countries similar to Trinidad and Tobago or other developing countries (20 points).

A firm which fails to meet any of the requirements will not be further assessed.

A minimum mark of 70% must be attained in order for a firm to be qualified.

After the firms have been evaluated, a shortlist of at least three but not more than six firms will be selected and invited to submit proposals for the provision of the required services.

The original and five (5) copies of the prequalification documents must be submitted to the Chairman, Central Tenders Board at the address below (address 2) on or before 1.00 p.m. on Thursday 8th January, 2004.
