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DETERMINATION OF COMPENSATION TO DEPENDANTS OF DECEASED EMPLOYEE

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TENDERS FOR PREQUALIFICATION OF CONSULTING FIRMS TO UNDERTAKE FEASIBILITY STUDY AND DETAILED DESIGN FOR DESILTING AND REHABILITATION WORKS AT THE HILLSBOROUGH DAM, TOBAGO FOR THE AGRICULTURE SECTOR REFORM PROGRAMME—TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE PROGRAMME (ASRP—TAP) MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE, LAND AND MARINE RESOURCES—IDB LOAN NO. 882/OC-TT

IN 1996 THE GOVERNMENT OF THE REPUBLIC OF TRINIDAD AND TOBAGO (GORTT) through the Ministry of Agriculture, Land and Marine Resources accessed loan funding from the Inter-American Development Bank (IDB) to assist in the implementation of an Agriculture Sector Reform Programme—Technical Assistance Programme (ASRP—TAP), IDB Loan No. 882/OC-TT. The ASRP—TAP was designed, *inter alia*, to enhance the performance of the Agricultural Sector thereby increasing its contribution to national income as well as foster economic diversification.

As part of the Land Use Policy and Administration Component of the ASRP—TAP, the Government is proposing to undertake a feasibility study and detailed design for desilting and rehabilitation works at the Hillsborough Dam located in Tobago.

More specifically, the objective of the study is to assess the present situation of the catchment areas inclusive of desilting needs, as well as the structure of the dam including a stability analysis of the dam in order to prepare a comprehensive rehabilitation project to restore and improve control systems.

In this connection, the GORTT is inviting expressions of interest from consultants from IDB member countries to undertake this project. Interested firms, whether acting singly or in joint venture, are required to submit a completed prequalification questionnaire along with a statement of interest.

Firms will be shortlisted in accordance with the following requirements and criteria-

Requirements:

A. Eligibility.

- B. Existence/Non Existence of Litigation Matters.
- C. Financial Capacity.
- D. Language Capability.

Criteria:

- (1) General work experience of the firm (40 points).
- (2) Experience in Similar Work (40 points).
- (3) Experience in countries similar to Trinidad and Tobago or other developing countries (20 points).

A minimum mark of 70% must be attained in order for a firm to be shortlisted.

After the firms have been evaluated, a shortlist of at least three but not more than six firms will be selected and invited to submit detailed proposals for the provision of the required services.

The original and six (6) copies of the prequalification documents must be submitted to the Chairman, Central Tenders Board at the address below (address 3) on or before 1.00 p.m. on Thursday 15th January, 2004.
