### DETERMINATION OF COMPENSATION TO DEPENDANTS OF DECEASED EMPLOYEE

a workman lately employed with Ramco Industries Limited

COMPENSATION in the above matter having been deposited with me under section 9 of the Workmen's Compensation Act, the dependants of the said Bobby Bowen are hereby required to appear before the Commissioner on THURSDAY THE 1ST DAY OF JULY, 2004, at 9.00 o'clock in the forenoon at the Hall of Justice, Port-of-Spain, when the Commissioner shall proceed to determine the distribution thereof.

Proof of relationship of dependants to the deceased workman will be required by the Commissioner to be furnished by claimants at the enquiry. Such proof to be in the form of certificates of birth and of marriage as in the circumstances be necessary.

A claimant for funeral expenses of the deceased must submit and prove his claim to the Commissioner on or before the 1st day of July, 2004.

*(Customs Act, Chap. 78:01)*

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred upon the Comptroller of Customs and Excise under the Customs Act, Chap. 78:01, I, Joseph A. Renaud, Acting Comptroller of Customs and Excise, acting under the provisions of section 263(2) of the said Act, do hereby appoint the place specified in the Schedule hereto to be a Private Warehouse for the storage, pending entry for home consumption or export, of the following goods, as shall be warehoused by or in the private warehouse of Messrs. Toyota Trinidad and Tobago Limited, located at Don Miguel Extension Road, San Juan, Motor Vehicles and such other goods as I may subsequently approve.

#### SCHEDULE

The northern section of a building owned by TUCANA LTD. comprising an upper floor measuring (91.44 m. x 21.03 m.) and western end of the lower floor measuring (60.96 m. x 21.03 m.) with a total area of 3205 sq. m. Ramp area 76 sq. m. connects lower and upper floor.

The structure is made of steel and concrete and covered by galvanize.

The northern, southern, eastern, and western walls are of concrete blocks with a sliding steel door on the southern side. The premises is bounded on the north by land owned by R. Ragoonanan, on the south by land owned by Emily Kellian, on the east partly by lands owned by Theresa Ramkhelawan and Judy Ramkhelawansingh and partly by land of Mabel Ramdhan and separated by a road reserve (Amar Drive) ten (10) metres wide and on the west by land owned by Joseph Latchman.

Appears before the Public Service Appeal Board.
