PUBLIC STATEMENT OF THE
STATUTORY AUTHORITIES'
SERVICE COMMISSION IN
COMPLIANCE WITH SECTION 7,8
AND 9 OF THE FREEDOM OF
INFORMATION ACT (FOIA) 1999

- 1. In accordance with Sections 7,8 and 9 of the FO1 Act, 1999 (FOIA) the Statutory Authorities' Service Commission is required by law, to publish a statement listing the documents held and the information available to the public.
- 2. The Freedom of Information Act gives members of the public:-
  - A legal right for each person to access information held by the Statutory Authorities' Service Commission
  - (2) A legal right for each person to have official information relating to him/herself amended where it is incomplete, incorrect or misleading

- (3) A legal right to obtain reasons for adverse Decisions made regarding an applicant's request for information under the FOIA
- (4) A legal right to complain to the Ombudsman and to apply to the High Court for Judicial Review to challenge adverse decisions made under the FOIA

#### Section 7(1)(a)(i)

#### <u>Structure, Role and Function of the Statutory</u> Authorities' Service Commission

The Statutory Authorities' Service Commission was established by Act #16 of 1966, which was amended by Acts #45 of 1979 and #8 of 1983. According to Sections 4(1) and 5(1) of the Statutory Authorities' Service Commission Act Chapter 24:01, the Commission has the power to appoint persons to be or act as officers and to transfer, promote, remove and exercise disciplinary control over persons so appointed. An officer is defined as a person holding a pensionable office in the service of a Statutory Authority and whose remuneration is paid on a monthly basis.

- 4. The following fourteen (14) Statutory Authorities fall under the control of the Commission -
  - Agricultural Society of Trinidad and Tobago
  - Arima Borough Corporation
  - Cocoa and Coffee Industry Board
  - National Housing Authority
  - National Lotteries Control Board

- San Fernando City Corporation
- St. Dominic's Children's Home
- St. Jude's School for Girls
- St. Mary's Children Home
- St. Michael's School for Boys
- Sugar Industry Labour Welfare Committee
- Zoological Society of Trinidad and Tobago

However, the Commission has recently noted proposals for the restructuring of the National Housing Authority and formation of a Company which does not fall under the purview of the Statutory Authorities' Service Commission.

#### <u>Procedure to be followed to access documents</u> <u>from the Statutory Authorities' Service</u> <u>Commission Department</u>

TENDERS are invited for the Restoration of the Infrastructure of the Fort King George Heritage Park—Phase 2B and Phase 2C for the Division of Tourism, Transportation, Enterprise Development and Settlements, Tobago House of Assembly.

Tenders must be submitted separately for Phase 2B and Phase 2C, as separate contracts will be awarded.

Tender documents and drawings may be obtained during the hours of 8.00 a.m. to 4.00 p.m. from the Central Tenders Board's Office, 116, Frederick Street, Port-of-Spain.

Tenderers are required to pay a tender deposit of one thousand (\$1,000.00) dollars each payable by cash or certified cheque to the Director of Contracts at the Board's Office, 116, Frederick Street, Port-of-Spain. The original receipt must accompany the tender.

In addition, a certificate of Compliance issued in accordance with the National Insurance Act must be submitted.

A pre-tender meeting will be held at the Officers' Quarters, Fort King George Heritage Park, Scarborough, Tobago, on Wednesday 19th October, 2005 at 10.00 a.m.

A claimant for funeral expenses of the deceased must submit and prove his claim to the Commissioner on or before the 25th day of October, 2005.
