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INDEX OF RETAIL PRICES—November, 2010 (Base: January, 2003 = 100)

The following Memorandum on the Index of Retail Prices is published for general information.

The All Items Index of Retail Prices calculated from prices collected for the month of November, 2010 was 179.3 representing a decrease of 1.3 points or 0.7% below the Index for October, 2010.

GENERAL INDEX

The annual rate of inflation as measured by the percentage change in the average All Items Index for the period January— November, 2010 over that for the period January—November, 2009 was 10.3%. This reflects an increase when compared with a rate of inflation of 7.5% observed in the average All Items Index for the period January—November, 2009 over the average All Items Index for the same period in 2008.

## SECTION INDICES

## FOOD AND NON-ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES

The Index for Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages decreased from 403.4 in October, 2010 to 395.6 in November, 2010, reflecting a decrease of 1.9%. Contributing significantly to this decrease was the general downward movement in the prices of whole chicken, ochroes, sweet potatoes, christophene, cucumber, dasheen, sweet pepper, limes, celery, chive, hot peppers and oranges. However, the full impact of these price decreases was offset by the general increase in the prices of fish—cavalli and red fish, duck, yams, irish potatoes, pumpkin, melongene, watercress, lettuce and dry coconut.

Price changes in this section, for the month of November, 2010 accounted for a net overall decrease of 1.4 points in the All Items Index.

## OTHER SECTIONS

A further review of the data for November, 2010 compared with October, 2010 reflected increases in the sub-indices for Alcoholic Beverages and Tobacco 3.5%; and Health 0.1%. However, a decline was noted in the sub-index for Clothing and Footwear 0.2%.

Price changes in these sections for the month of November, 2010 accounted for a net overall increase of 0.1 point in the All Items Index.
