ORDER OF THE COMMISSION

WHEREAS the Respondent has been a registered issuer with the Commission since December 19, 2002;

AND WHEREAS the Respondent is incorporated in Barbados. The Respondent's shares are listed on the Barbados Stock Exchange and cross listed on the London Stock Exchange and the Trinidad and Tobago Stock Exchange;

AND WHEREAS by way of a letter dated December 12, 2009, the Respondent advised the Commission that it had invited NIBB to subscribe for and NIBB had agreed to acquire the Shares in the Respondent by means of a private placement ("the Distribution"), claiming prospectus exemptions under section 75(1)(i) and/or section 75(2) of the Securities Industry Act, 1995 ("the Act"). The Respondent further sought confirmation from the Commission that it could proceed with the transaction;

AND WHEREAS on December 17, 2009, the Respondent applied to the Commission to register the Shares by submitting a Registration Statement Form No. 4 and paid the fees associated with such application;

AND WHEREAS by way of a letter dated December 23, 2009, the Staff of the Commission advised the Respondent that it was prepared to consider the exemption from the prospectus requirements on the condition that the Distribution was treated as a limited offering" in keeping with section 75(4) of the Act, provided that the following conditions were met:

- (a) the Respondent obtain an agreement from NIBB that NIBB would file a prospectus if the sale of the Shares purchased by it results in there being more than thirty-five (35) owners within six (6) months of the Distribution and submit such agreement to the Commission;
- (b) no selling or promotional expenses are paid or incurred in connection with the Distribution except for professional services or other services other than the solicitation of investors by the Respondent; and

- (c) The Respondent issue a prominently placed press release in all three (3) daily newspapers in Trinidad & Tobago seven (7) days prior to the distribution ("the Press Release"):
 - i. disclosing the nature and substance of the change; and
 - ii. including the names of the issuer and the purchaser, the number of the Shares and the price/value of the Shares (including the percentage owned by NIBB before and after the Distribution)("the Conditions");

AND WHEREAS by letter dated December 28, 2009 the Respondent referred to a telephone conversation held on December 28, 2009 and confirmed to the Commission that the Barbados Securities Commission had already given its receipt for registration of the Shares and had granted the Respondent prospectus exemption under sections of the Barbados law materially identical to those claimed but rejected by the Commission under Trinidad and Tobago law. This letter requested the Commission to reconsider its position as stated in its letter of December 23, 2009 or, alternately, state the basis on which it considered that the requirements of sections 75(1)(i) and 75(2) had not been satisfied;

AND WHEREAS with the full concurrence of the respective regulators in Barbados and London, the Shares were listed on the Barbados Stock Exchange on December 29, 2009 and on the London Stock Exchange on December 30, 2009;

AND WHEREAS by way of a letter dated December 30, 2009 the Commission advised the Respondent that the:

(a) conditions were based on specific regulatory concerns and a concern to maintain the integrity of the domestic securities market;

- (b) Staff considered that the requirement for the Respondent to obtain an agreement from NIBB that NIBB would file a prospectus if the sale of the Shares purchased by it resulted in there being more than thirty-five (35) owners within six (6) months of the Distribution and to submit such agreement to the Commission is necessary to uphold the intent of the law where a distribution has benefited from a prospectus exemption by virtue of being a limited offering;
- (c) Staff was also of the view that, while the prior approval of shareholders might not have been legally required for the transaction, it was in the interest of fairness and transparency as well as the proper functioning of the market that the shareholders and other stakeholders of the Respondent be provided with reasonable advance notice of the proposed change; and
- (d) it is on this basis of these regulatory concerns that the Respondent was asked to notify the public of Trinidad and Tobago prior to the Distribution;

AND WHEREAS by way of a letter dated December 30, 2009 the Respondent informed the Commission that NIBB had confirmed its intention to hold the Shares on a long-term basis and accordingly agreed to enter into a private placement agreement as requested by the Commission and submitted a draft of the Agreement to the Commission. Further, the Respondent submitted a draft of the Press Release to the Commission for review. The Respondent further informed the Commission that it was unable to comply with the seven (7) days prior notice to the Trinidad and Tobago market as the Distribution had been already completed under the laws of Barbados and the United Kingdom and that under the Barbados Securities Act any announcement made was required to be an announcement of completion of the Distribution. A copy of the approved and executed private placement agreement was filed with the Commission on February 22, 2010 and the approved Press Release was subsequently published by the Respondent in the newspapers in Trinidad & Tobago on January 5, 2010;

AND WHEREAS the Commission served the Notice of Contravention dated February 22, 2010 on the Respondent on February 22, 2010 and the Respondent wrote to the Commission on June 2, 2010 indicating that it was prepared to settle the matter;

AND WHEREAS on December 28, 2010 the Respondent entered into a proposed settlement agreement with the Staff of the Commission which was signed by the authorized representative of the Commission for and on behalf of the Commission and by the authorized representatives of the Respondent for and on behalf of the Respondent ("the Settlement Agreement"), in which the parties agreed to a settlement, subject to the approval of the Settlement Panel;

AND WHEREAS the Settlement Panel approved the Settlement Agreement and agreed to submit the Settlement Agreement to the Commission;

AND WHEREAS the Respondent shall pay to the Commission the sum of Twenty Five Thousand Trinidad and Tobago Dollars (TT\$25,000.00) within twenty-eight (28) days of the making of this Order;

AND WHEREAS the Commission has considered the Settlement Agreement and is of the opinion that it is in the public interest to make this Order.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT:

- (a) The procedure outlined under the Securities Industry (Hearings and Settlements) Practice
 Rules, 2008 has been followed;
- (b) The Respondent is in contravention of a prescribed condition of the Commission for the Limited Offering pursuant to sections 75(4) and 75(7)(a) of the Act by reason of its

failure to issue the Press Release within seven (7) days prior to the issuance of the Shares to the NIBB and shall within twenty-eight (28) days of the making of this Order pay to the Commission the sum of Twenty Five Thousand Trinidad and Tobago Dollars (TT\$25,000.00) as the fine in this matter; and

(c) This Order shall be published in the Trinidad and Tobago Gazette.

THE 2010 UPDATED PUBLIC STATEMENT OF NATIONAL ENERGY CORPORATION OF TRINIDAD AND TOBAGO LIMITED IN COMPLIANCE WITH SECTIONS 7, 8 and 9 OF THE FREEDOM OF INFORMATION ACT 1999

Under the Freedom of Information Act 1999 ("FOIA"), National Energy Corporation of Trinidad and Tobago Limited (NEC) is required by Section 7, 8 and 9 of the FOIA to publish the

following statements which list the documents and information generally available to the public. This includes the structure and functions of NEC and a list of categories of documents held by NEC. The FOIA also identifies those documents which are eligible for public access under it and sets out how to obtain same. The following information satisfies the legislative requirements of the FOIA. This is an Updated Public Statement.

The FOIA gives members of the public:

- 1. A legal right for each person to access information held by a Public Authority;
- 2. A legal right for each person to have official information relating to him/herself amended where it is incomplete, incorrect or misleading;
- 3. A legal right to obtain reasons for adverse decisions made regarding an applicant's request for information under the FOIA.
- 4. A legal right to complain to the Ombudsman and to apply to the High Court for Judicial Review to challenge adverse decisions made under the FOIA in accordance with sections 7 (1) (b) and 9 (2) (b) of the FOIA.

The National Energy Corporation of Trinidad and Tobago Limited publishes the following information as approved by the Minister of Energy and Energy Industries in accordance with sections 7 (1) (b) and 9 (2) (b):

STATEMENTS UNDER SECTION 7 OF THE ACT

Section 7 (1) (a) (i)

NEC is a wholly-owned subsidiary of The National Gas Company of Trinidad and Tobago Limited (NGC). NEC was incorporated as a company under the Companies Ordinance Chapter 31 on the 7^{th} September, 1979 and continued under the Companies Act 1995 on 7^{th} July, 1998 NEC holds no shareholding or equity interests in any other entity.

THE SCOPE OF BUSINESS OF NEC AND ITS AFFILIATED COMPANIES INCLUDE:

- The conceptualization, promotion, development and facilitation of new energy-based and downstream industries in Trinidad and Tobago.



- Monitoring oversight for the conduct, preparation and submission of Environmental Impact Assessment Studies to the EMA as and when required for the determination of CEC applications.
- Monitoring and auditing oversight capabilities for the implementation of CEC conditions on a project basis.

Towage and Harbour Operations performs the task of managing the operation, maintenance and co-ordination of the company's fleet of tugs and other ancillary crafts that provide towage services to visiting ships, rigs and other marine applications. Marketing & development of the towage service also falls within the department's responsibilities. The maintenance of the Point Lisas Harbour and its navigational aids is also a function of this department

PROCEDURE FOR ACCESSING OFFICIAL DOCUMENTS UNDER FOIA

How to Request Information

- 1) Requests and public services under the FOIA will be entertained between the hours of 9:00am and 12:00pm daily.
- 2) All requests for access to documents that are not readily available in the public domain are to be made on the *Request for Access to Official Document(s) Form* that is available from the Designated Officer or from the FOIA Unit.
- 3) Queries for amendments to documents containing personal information about the applicant are to be directed to the Designated Officer in the form of a letter.
- 4) To ensure prompt handling of requests, please address it to the Designated Officer of the National Energy Corporation of Trinidad and Tobago Limited.
- 5) Requests will be acknowledged as official when made on the prescribed form.
- 6) Applicants must provide sufficient information to enable the Designated Officer to identify the document(s) being requested. If insufficient information is provided clarification would be sought from the applicant.
- 7) The general policy is to answer all requests, both oral and written, for information. However, in order to have the rights given to the applicant by the FOIA (for example the right to challenge a decision if the request for information is refused), the applicant must make the request in writing.
- 8) If the applicant is not sure how to write his/her request or what details to include, communicate with our designated officer.
- 9) A request under the FOIA will not be processed to the extent that it asks for information which is readily available to the public, either from this public authority or from another public authority, for example, brochures, pamphlets, reports etc.

Time Allowed

- 1. Applicants will be notified within thirty (30) calendar days or before whether or not the request is approved.
- 2. Applicants whose requests are incomplete or unclear will be informed of same by the Designated Officer who will make arrangements to meet with the applicant for consultation with a view to clarifying the request.
- 3. The time limit of thirty (30) days will be suspended while consultation with the applicant is being undertaken, and resumes on the day the applicant confirms or alters the request.
- 4. If the thirty (30) day deadline is not met, the FOIA gives the applicant the right to proceed as though his/her request has been depied
- 5. If it appears that processing the applicant's requests may take longer than the statutory limit we will acknowledge the request and advise the applicant of the status.
- 6. Since there is a possibility that requests may be incorrectly addressed or misdirected, the applicant may wish to call or write to confirm that we have received the request and to ascertain its status.
- 7. Applicants, whose requests for documents are refused, will be notified by the Designated Officer in writing of the reasons for refusal. The Officer will consult with the applicant about alternative recourses that are open to him/her.

Fees and Charges

- 1. Details of charges for photocopies or purchase of documents will be determined based upon individual requests by applicants.
- 2. Applicants will be required to complete an official company invoice before funds are paid to the Cashier.
