INDEX OF RETAIL PRICES—October, 2014
(Base: January 2003 = 100)

THE following Memorandum on the Index of Retail Prices is published for general information.

The All Items Index of Retail Prices calculated from the prices collected for the month of October, 2014 was 229.4 representing an increase of 5.2 points or 2.3% above the All Items Index for September, 2014.

The percentage change in the All Items Index for the period January to October, 2014 over the period January to October, 2013 was 5.1%. This reflects a decrease when compared with the rate of inflation of 5.2% observed in the All Items Index for the period January to October, 2013 over the period January to October, 2012.

SECTION INDICES

FOOD AND NON-ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES

The Index for Food and Non-Alcoholic Beverages increased from 595.8 in September, 2014 to 625.0 in October, 2014, reflecting an increase of 4.9%. Contributing significantly to this increase was the general upward movement in the prices of limes, cucumber, hot peppers, sweet potatoes, oranges, tomatoes, yams, green pigeon peas, dasheen and watercress. However, the full impact of these price increases was offset by the general decrease in the prices of ochroes, celery, whole chickens, green bananas, chive, thyme, melongene, onions, garlic, carrot and plantain.

Price changes in this section for the month of October, 2014 accounted for a net overall increase of 5.3 points in the All Items Index.

OTHER SECTIONS

A further review of the data for October, 2014 compared with September, 2014, reflected increases in the sub-indices for Alcoholic Beverages and Tobacco of 0.2%, Housing, Water, Electricity, Gas and Other Fuels 0.4%, Transport 0.1%, Education 6.4% and Miscellaneous Goods and Services 0.2%. However, decreases were noted in the sub-indices for Clothing and Footwear of 0.1%, Furnishings, Household Equipment and Routine Maintenance of the House 0.1%, Health 0.9%, Recreation and Culture 2.4% and Hotels, Cafes and Restaurants 0.1%.

Price changes in the Other Sections for the month of October, 2014, accounted for a net overall decrease of 0.1 points in the All Items Index.
